### MISSION OAK HIGH SCHOOL COMMUNITY SERVICE REQUIREMENTS

### EARN A SERVICE PATCH!

Community service must be performed for a non-profit agency and not by working "for free" for a business. You will need to make sure the agency is on the approved list. If your agency is not yet on the list, you can provide them a *Non-Profit Agency Verification Form* to help get them approved.

### WHAT IS THE COMMUNITY SERVICE PATCH?

Students who perform at least 40 hours of community service for local non-profit agencies can earn a Mission Oak Community Service patch. It is important before volunteering that the agency has registered and is on the approved list of non-profit organizations with Mission Oak High School.

The purpose of the Community Service Patch is to provide all Mission Oak High School students the opportunity to have a positive impact on our local community while learning that service to others is an ongoing part of life. Students who choose to strive towards earning the patch must complete their 40 hours of service and submit all the required documentation provided in this packet by May 1<sup>st</sup>. All documentation is to be turned in to the Career Center.

### WHAT QUALIFIES AS COMMUNITY SERVICE?

- Community service hours must be completed with a non-profit organization(s) from May 2<sup>nd</sup> through May 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Non-profit organization must be able to use student volunteers outside of the school day & on weekends.
- A student may volunteer for a singular organization or at a variety of organizations.
- Students are encouraged to complete their hours in areas related to their personal interests.
- Paid experiences or internships do not qualify.
- Working without pay at a business, babysitting, or for family duties does not qualify.
- Students may earn hours for working as "hands-on" support of charitable fundraisers.
- Only volunteer hours from approved agencies will be accepted. It is the student's responsibility to check if the organization has been approved.
- If an organization is not yet on the approved list, students may provide a "Non-Profit Agency Registration Form" to the organization to get them approved.

### HOW DO I PROVE MY COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS?

- Students must complete a "Student Community Service Verification Form" for each organization volunteered for.
- A supervisor's signature & contact information is required on each form. A parent may not sign as the supervisor.
- Service Forms of hours completed must be submitted by the end of each 9 week grading period.
- The deadline for completing the final 40 service hours and submitting all necessary forms is May 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Forms submitted after May 1<sup>st</sup> will not count towards earning a service patch for that school year.
